Abstract

The integration of artificial intelligence (AI) into medicine holds great promise, offering advancements in diagnosis, treatment, and personalized care. However, this rapid adoption raises significant ethical challenges. In this talk, I will highlight some of the issues that medical practitioners – as well as society at large – are already facing and that require ethical awareness. Balancing innovation with patient safety, transparency, and fairness is critical to navigating these ethical complexities.

Mirko Daniel Garasic is an assistant professor in moral philosophy at Roma Tre University.
