RAZVRSTAVANJE KORESPONDENCIJE ANDRIJE DUDIĆA (1533–1589)

Glavninu ostavštine Andrije Dudića (1533–1589), slavnog humanista 16. stoljeća, sačinjava njegova bogata znanstvena i diplomatska korespondencija, koja sadrži gotovo 2000 pisama, koja je Dudić izmijenio s vodećim osobama svog vremena.

Korespondencija Andrije Dudića, nastala od 1554. do 1580. i objavljena pod naslovom *Epistulae I–VI* u izdanju Instituta za filozofiju i sociologiju Poljske akademije znanosti i Instituta književnih studija Mađarske akademije, bit će u ovom radu razvrstana s obzirom na sljedeće odrednice: kronologiju njihova nastanka, jezik kojim su pisana, status korespondenata (prirodni filozofi, crkveni velikodostojnici, državni vladari, državni službenici, članovi obitelji i prijatelji) i tematiku pisama (prirodnofilozofska, politička, teološka i privatna).

Među Dudićevim korespondentima ističu se poznate osobe kulturnog i političkog života tog doba: car Maksimilijan II, poljska kraljica Katarina, teolozi Theodor De Beze, Johann Wolf i Girolamo Zanchi. U Dudićev filozofski i znanstveni krug ulaze Joachim Rheticus, Joachim Camerarius, Joachim Camerarius Mlađi, Paul Fabricius, Johannes Praetorius, Johannes Crato von Krafftheim i Tadeas Hajek.

CLASSIFICATION OF THE CORRESPONDENCE OF ANDRIJA DUDIĆ (1533–1589)

The bulk of the legacy of Andrija Dudić (1533–1589), the famous humanist of the sixteenth century, includes his rich scientific and diplomatic correspondence of nearly 2,000 letters which he exchanged with the leading figures of his time.

The correspondence of Andrija Dudić, written between 1554 and 1580 and published in *Epistulae I–VI* by the Institute of Philosophy and Sociology of the Polish Academy of Sciences and the Institute of Literary Studies of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences, will be classified in this paper by the following criteria: by date, by language, by correspondent status (natural philosophers, church officials, rulers, public officials, family members and friends), and by subject-matter (natural-philosophical, political, theological, and private).

Among Dudić's correspondents were some of the most eminent figures of the political and cultural life of his day: Emperor Maximilian II, Queen Catherine of Poland, theologians Theodor de Beze, Johann Wolf and Girolamo Zanchi, while his philosophical and scientific circle included Joachim Rheticus, Joachim Camerarius, Joachim Camerarius Jr., Paul Fabricius, Johannes Praetorius, Johannes Crato von Krafftheim, and Tadeas Hajek.
